Amanda has done work for us in earlier years.

Beresfield update: We are still working through some annual planned maintenance in co-ordination with the managing agent. Committee approved the purchase of a Stihl Vacuum Cleaner and related water pressure equipment from our supporter Anest Iwata. This equipment will assist the internal cleaning preparation prior to painting. Another supporter 'Telmo' recently completed the manufacture of a 'tow hitch'...we were able to borrow one from the Bankstown Catalina folk and use that as a template. Base Tours: Earlier this month we had a planned visit from 20 members of the Classic Commercial Vintage Truck Club.
